The Holy Word

I wonder how many of us really know the Bible! Many of us have heard some of the stories. Many of us have read bits and pieces of it, maybe some have even read it cover to cover. Certainly we gain much from reading it, studying it, praying with it. But how many of us know the mechanics of the Bible itself. How is it divided? How many books, chapters, verses does it contain? Why is it organized in its current form? Who decided what books would be contained in it when there are so many other writings of ancient prophets and scholars? Why were some books written at all? What is the history of the Bible? What does each book contain?

This fall we are going to begin a study of some of those very questions and take a look at just what this amazing book is. The Bible is still the number 1 selling book around the world. As new groups of Christians grow the Bible remains the number one source of inspiration for growing in faith. It's power as the living word of God is invaluable in changing hearts and minds, in transforming faith to a deeper, more mature level. One never knows what passage, story, verse will inspire anyone to deeper understanding and closer relationship with God. Unfortunately the Bible is also used to further human agendas and ideologies that can harm rather than build up the Kingdom of God. Many have pointed to pieces of scripture that seem to justify some pretty exclusionary behavior and ideas. So it is to our advantage in filtering out truth ideas to know as much as we can about this incredible book. When we know the history of God's people

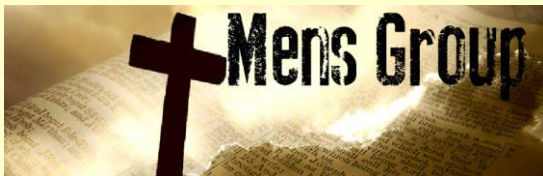
